The Factory Bridge crosses White Deer Creek in White Deer Township approximately one mile from the village of West Deer. This covered bridge has a combination multi King and Queen Trusses. The single span bridge of 60 feet was built in 1880 and has a roadbed of 16 feet wide. It is in good condition and has been repaired in 1954 and 1976.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

This bridge spans White Deer Creek west of the hamlet of White Deer. It is named for a former woolens mill which stood near by, and took its power from the creek. The factory burned a century ago, but a cluster of houses remains a short distance away on the old White Deer Turnpike (County Road 59031). It is the only remaining covered bridge on White Deer Creek.

The bridge is now in good condition and has been recently painted.

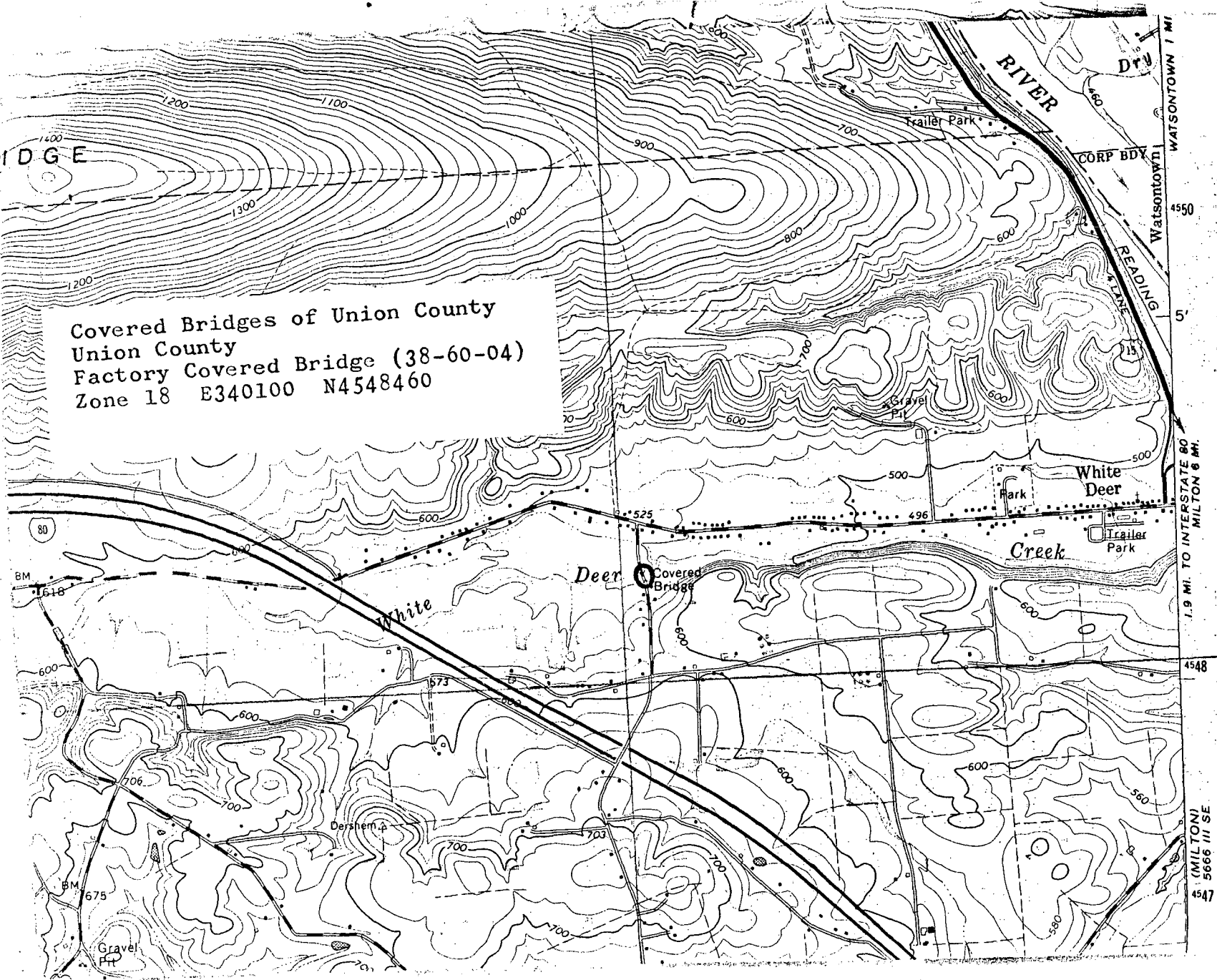
